Make Sense of Sentences

This game reinforces the vocabulary learnt in lessons #1-3 inclusive of the original Hickey stories (including this version of #4) and introduces the parts of the sentence. If the student has already learned about sentence structure this will be a revision and reinforcement activity.

Preparation:

Cut out the words below plus the Headings Cards and Sentence Examples. Glue onto card and laminate. Note: Do not laminate the blank cards or, if you wish to, remember to provide the player with a pen that will write on the plastic! The Example Sheet is only for ideas, not for copying.

How to play:

The Headings Cards are placed on the desk/table in the following order - Subject/Noun, Verb, Object/Noun, Prepositions, Pronouns and Adjectives. The student sorts out the Word cards under the correct Headings and then creates grammatically correct sentences using the colour-coded cards. S/he can look at the Hickey stories and the examples for guidance and can construct their own sentences. If wished, they can complete the blank cards with words of their choosing. They then choose six sentences and write them out.
